Our new experimental farm

ur new experimental farm at Sukkankollai in Madurantakam taluk was inaugurated by the Kancheepuram District Collector Mr. K. Rajaraman on 12th July 2002. On this occasion we had also put up an exhibition on Organic Farming. This exhibition had a good display of indigenous paddy varieties (in the form of ear heads, seeds and photographs) and dishes made from some of these varieties. The Collector inaugurated this exhibition. Besides this, he released the first issue of the "Indigenous Agriculture Newsletter" in Tamil. This function was attended by nearly 300 farmers. They were also given an opportunity to share their views regarding their experience with CIKS and its

activities. The Collector distributed prizes for the quiz programme which was held for our trainers and also gave away support provided to the farmers for organic farming under the GTZ programme. In his address to the gathering the Collector advised the farmers to organise themselves and work rather than depend on Government programmes and subsidies for everything. At the end of the programme he also started the tree planting activity at our Centre. We have started work in full swing there. Detailed plans have been worked out for the next cropping season. Green manure crops have been cultivated and ploughed in for increasing the soil fertility. We have also started work on setting up a medicinal plant nursery and put up demonstrations of different compost pits. We have planted several trees and have started our biodiversity conservation work. We would be conserving more than 100 varieties of paddy and vegetables here.

News from our Farmers' Network

Pumpkin beetle is a common pest attacking vegetable crops which are cucurbitaceous like pumpkin, gourds, watermelon etc. It affects the leaves and sucks the sap from the flowers. Farmers of Kayirambedu and Moolakkazhani villages of Kattankolathur block have been using an indigenous method to control this beetle. They mix dung of the common brown sheep with cowdung in equal quantities. To this, 5 times the volume of water is added. This is filtered well and sprayed on the leaves. Within 4 days of spraying, the beetles are effectively controlled. This indigenous pest control technique has been practised for the past 20 years.

PROJECT WATCH

A round-up of our activities this quarter

CAPART Training programme

A short-term residential training programme for farmers of Tirukazhukundram block was conducted on 11th and 12th July at Singaperumal Koil training centre. 41 farmers participated in workshop. Similarly, a short-term residential training programme for farmers of Madurantakam block was conducted on 5th and 6th of August at our Sukkankollai centre. 54 farmers participated in this workshop. These work shops covered topics on the role of indigenous seeds and the importance of organic farming. Different methods of compost preparation, management of paddy and vegetable pests diseases, preparation of plant extracts were some of the other topics covered in this programme. importance of medicinal plants and their uses were also highlighted. These workshops were coordinated by our field team. A follow up workshop would be conducted three months later.

CAPART follow up workshop

A follow up workshop to the organic farming training held during April 2002 was conducted on 18th September at Sirkazhi. This was conducted at Vettai-

karaniruppu village near Vedaranyam. Subhashini Sridhar coordinated this All the 15 meeting. participants who attended the earlier training programme attended this workshop. was encouraging for us to note that all the farmers who had participated in the training workshop had started activites in organic farming in one way or the other.

Another follow up workshop with farmers who participated in short-term organic farming workshops earlier this year was conducted at Sirkazhi on 25th August. 30 farmers participated in this meeting. Farmers shared their experiences on organic cultivation. The participants also visited the CIKS experimental farm at Agani and also the field's of other organic farmers.

Organic Farming Workshops

A series of three workshops on organic farming were conducted during July under the UNDP programme for conservation of indigenous genetic resources. These workshops were conducted in Puzhuthivakkam village in Madurantakam on 7th, Venpakkam village in Tirukazhukundram on 17th. Kattiyampandal village in Madurantakam on 26th respectively. A total of 85

farmers participated in these workshops. Similarly, a one day workshop was conducted on 18th August at Moolakazhani village in Chengalpattu taluk. A total of 19 farmers participated in this workshop. In these workshops farmers were taught to identify the pests paddy and their predators. A detailed session on non-chemical pest management was conducted. The participants were also taught to make different plant extracts for pest control.

Capacity Building for Sustainable Agriculture

As a part of the capacity building programme under the GTZ project, several workshops conducted. On 12th July a quiz programme was conducted for the participants. It was coordinated by K. Vijayalakshmi. This quiz programme was based on all the topics that were covered under the training programme till now. The trainees participated very enthusiastically. winners were awarded prizes by the District Collector during programme which was held that evening. On 19th July, a one day course on First Aid was held. It was conducted by Mr. S. Chandran of St. John's Ambulance Association. The trainees found this course very useful.

There was an experience sharing session on the 21st

of August. On this day all the trainees presented their experiences on organic farming in the form of posters. It was an excellent interactive session which was also attended by our prefunding evaluator Mr. T.C.A. Srinivasa Ramanujam.

On 12th September, the theme was Vrkshayurveda and its importance in organic agriculture. A.V. Balasubramanian gave an overview of the scope and importance of Vrkshayurveda. S. Arumugasamy and S. Thambidurai summarised the practical experiments conducted on different crops and the successes to the farmers. This was followed by a discussion. On 24^{th} September Dr. K. Abdul Razak, Retd. Veterinary Surgeon was invited to conduct a session on the importance of ethnoveterinary medicine. Dr. Razak gave a detailed introduction regarding the importance of indigenous cattle. In his theory session he covered various aspects such as how to look for a good cattle, what are the types of cattle to avoid, cattle feed, hygiene etc. He also dealt with curing of various diseases by use of ethnoveterinary practices. This was followed by a practical session where he demonstrated certain practices with the use of a cow, goat, buffalo and hen.

A.V. Balasubramanian and H. Saraswathy attended the meeting.

UNDP meeting at Delhi

On 8^h and 9^h August, A.V. Balasubramanian was at Delhi to attend a meeting of the Steering Committee for the UNDP – Ministry of Environment project on Medicinal Plants conservation that is being implemented by FRLHT.


Visit of World Bank Team
